

*Over the past 5 years*, The Dolphin Project Photo ID Research Surveys have been impacted by storms, high winds, family issues, crew members moving, Covid, skippers selling their boats, members passing and Covid.

For this 5-year abundance count, subadults have been counted as adults and will be counted that way going forward for Photo-ID surveys on the updated Event Sheet which is now on our website. It's impossible to identify one dolphin or two dolphins together as subadults unless there are adults close by. Even then, it's only a guess; in which case, the number should be rounded up to adult.
