

REGISTER for survey

<u>COORDINATE Survey Logistics with Team Leader</u>: date, time, location, boat restrictions, storage availability, weather, etc.

BEFORE GOING ON THE BOAT		
	Check your battery	
	Clean your lens	
	Make sure to have protection from sea spray and rain	
	Check your settings – optimize for conditions	
	Remove filters	
	If it's hot outside & camera has been in AC, expose it to outside air early in the morning.	
	Set digital camera for highest quality JPEGS – NOT RAW	
	Set digital camera to single shot, not burst or bracketed

ON SURVEY

- Take a picture of the Event sheet with completed heading
- Take usable dorsal fin images. Multiples are OK
- Sharp focus is critical
- Try to get Left an Right sides of same dorsal fin
- Fill as much of the frame as possible. Total fin should be out of the water.
- Communicate with Skipper and Team Leader to optimize the best shots
- Multiple photographers should focus on different dolphins
- Take shots of damage, scarring and unusual behavior
- Try not to photograph into the sun
- Take a shot of the Event Sheet after the data for that sighting has been entered

QUALITY – not Quantity
